This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Our curriculum is informed by the model music curriculum. At present, we use Charanga however, we are in the process of redesigning our curriculum to be based around the BBC Ten Pieces materials.

Music is timetabled for one hour a week in all year groups.

As part of our music curriculum, pupils in KS2 learn an instrument each year. In Year 3 they learn the recorder; in Year 4 they have First Access lessons with a peripatetic teacher to learn a brass instrument; in Year 5 they learn to play the keyboard; in Year 6 they learn the ukulele.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

Peripatetic – Keyboards; guitars; violin; brass;

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.
